


Since our last update a number of meetings and training sessions have taken place in Ratoath Community Centre in partnership with Friends of ASI.

GIVING BACK TO NATURE WITH RATOATH SCOUTS

Project at Ratoath Scout's Den, Jamestown beside College.

The goal is to create an area to balance biodiversity while allowing scouts to appreciate nature and the environment through learning and play. The promoting group is importance of biodiversity by involving members in all aspects of the plan.

A focus group was set up within our ranks to manage this project.

So far, 25 native Irish trees from Freetrees.ie. have been planted to create a mini woodland. Future scouts will eventually see the benefit of mature trees where thev can hang hammocks, build shelters and do woodland-based activities.

A no-mow area has been established to encourage natural wildflowers to return. Yellow rattle seeds and bulbs have been planted here.

Two water butts to gather rainwater have been installed. These ensured we had water during the warmer summer months to keep our new trees alive.

Log piles have been created as a natural habitat for insects.

In October 2024 we won the Ratoath Municipal District Youth Project Pride of Place Award. This gave us the pride and confidence to keep going and keep developing our plan.

We held a large den 'Clean Up Weekend" in early February 2025 supported by scout leaders, youth members and parents.

> A living willow hedge and structure has begun to be planted. In the future we will be able to harvest sally rods from this to make further structures and teach our scouts basketry

> 50 native hedgerow trees from "Trees on the Land" will be planted in the spring. These include blackthorn, hawthorn, crab apple, hazel and rowan. Work has also started on building a wildlife pond.

> will be educational There signage erected at each area to highlight what has been done and why it's important.

> These measures will benefit wildlife such as hedgehogs, frogs, newts, birds, butterflies, insects and the community.




The play takes place on the day that the winners and losers of the group meet up to drink to Flavin's memory and looks at their lives, lost dreams and their place in the new Ireland.




