



RATOATH COMMUNITY EMPLOYMENT SCHEME

St Oliver's Community Centre in Ratoath has been a sponsor for a twenty-five place Community Employment Scheme since 2021. The Scheme is designed to help unemployed people get back into the workplace. It provides a framework where a Participant will get work experience, on-the-job training and can work towards obtaining QQI Quality Assurance Certified Educational Awards.

CE participants are also able to apply for external work experience during their time on the project and on completion, participants are supported to progress to employment/ self-employment or further training and education.

The Ratoath CE Scheme is unique in what it offers in terms of training. work experience and new opportunities for potential Participants. It also allows Participants the opportunity to take time and look at where they are in life and what path they want to take for the future. Education and training are lifelong interventions that give people the self-confidence to embrace change and achieve their long-term ambitions.

To obtain that dream job or business idea you have always wanted to develop and bring to fruition; CE is a great starting point. CE has all the connections at all levels to help Participants achieve their dreams.

An example of the roles currently on offer includes Grounds-person, Caretaker, Tidy Towns and General Domestic. The community Projects involved are The Venue, Ratoath Community Centre, Ratoath community Sports Campus, Ratoath Tidy Towns, Independent Living, Ratoath Harps, Ratoath Pitch & Putt, Ratoath GAA, Ratoath Parish, Ratoath BMX Club and Ratoath Rugby Club.

The basic qualifying criteria for becoming a Scheme Participant is that you are currently unemployed, over the age of twenty-one and in receipt of a Social Welfare Payment or signing credits. People who are on a reduced payment due to a means test are also eligible and will return to full payment amount once they are successful in obtaining a place on our scheme. Community Employment is funded by DSP.


