

### WHY THE LEMONADE KART?

The old saying goes that when life gives you lemons you make lemonade and that there the Lemonade piece comes from. The Kart bit is a little more complex. Imagine one of the trams that you see in San Francisco, well I always imagined that The Lemonade Kart was a trolley that you could jump on if you are looking for a little positivity. You can hop on and off as often as you like.

A number of years ago I was volunteering with a local rescue organisation. Our work never involved actually rescuing people it was always more of a recovery operation. I began to think that maybe it would be a good idea to spend my efforts on prevention rather than being at the end of the line when someone was successful in taking their own life. While this may sound morbid it actually was a reality.

Since I had struggles with my own mental health since a very early stage, and I am a very open individual. I thought that if I was to openly speak out about my mental health that it may encourage others to have the conversation.

If others were to speak about their struggles it may allow intervention and

hopefully prevent someone coming to physical harm.

A key concept of The Lemonade Kart is that we are all part of a team and as such we have a responsibility to look out for our team members. We are parts of many different teams, Family Team, Friends Team, Work and sports. When you are part of a team it is important that everyone on that team is fit and healthy for the team to function properly.

Therefore we should be on the lookout for someone on our team who is not doing good – check in with them and see what we could do to help. Also as part of a team we should be able to reach out and ask for help when we need it. Even if it's just to have the conversation.

The Lemonade Kart is my full time passion outside of my regular working life. I work in the charity area but one day hope that The Lemonade Kart could become my full time job.

For the last five years I have been posting on social media. I have a daily video

that I publish every morning. These videos are mostly things that I have just picked up so I share them in the hope that someone out there might also get a lift or learn something new too.

More recently, I have been converting an old van into a mobile information hub and a way to raise awareness around the services that are available to people who are struggling with mental health issues. I'll be visiting communities and clubs advocating for positive mental health, so keep an eye on our social media pages for updates on that.

All of my efforts have a financial implication and any of the work that I do is self funded, although I ran a very successful GoFundMe to raise the money to have the van repaired and prepared for it's roadworthiness test.

sanitised, appropriate signage and hand sanitising stations were in place, ensure the one-way system and do the temperature checks.

Because of Covid my contract extended and my responsibilities changed as the rules of Covid eased.

For two years then I had a variety of roles in Ratoath Community Centre. I was running a Parent & Toddler Group and helping on Bingo nights selling books or calling numbers. You might have seen me on the theatre door before the shows, cleaning or setting up rooms for the activities happening in the centre. The best part about the job is that I have met so many nice and inspiring people here and learned about new opportunities that lay ahead.

During the time on these schemes I have done following courses paid by schemes: Customer Service, HACCP, First Aid, Manual handling, Fire safety, PSA Security Guarding License and ICDL.

This year my role was changed and now includes creating the Ratoath News & Views newsletter, gathering



I pay for website hosting and the running costs of The Lemonade Kart. Hopefully I will get some sponsorship from local businesses looking to do their bit for mental health awareness and I am open to any offers!

The Lemonade Kart is a community where everyone is welcome, you can dip in and out as often as you like.



Hi, my name is Renate. I am working in the Ratoath Community Centre under Community Employment Scheme (CES).

After having my second child I had concerns about getting back into jobs market. The anxiety about how to manage my time and who is going to mind the kids was overwhelming. So, after some time on the Jobseekers Allowance, I got a letter from TUS inviting me to an interview. On the interview I realised that the job I could be offered has very flexible working hours and I could easily work the 19.5 hours around my daily routine.

I started as a Covid safety officer in Ratoath Community Centre in August 2020 which meant I had to make sure the premises were Notice Board. Also, I am back on Bingo nights and occasionally Front of House on the show nights. I would like to thank the Community Employment schemes and my

interest in advertising, interviewing

local people, and working on Ratoath

colleagues for the opportunities, and encourage everyone who is unemployed to explore the Community Employment Scheme and give yourself a chance to upskill and get back out in the workforce.

The headline on social media read "Chairs from iconic Dublin nightclub Lillie's Bordello up for grabs". After moving to Ireland in the mid-90's I spent many a night & the early hours of the next morning ensconced in these chairs before the clubs closure in 2019. So to cut a long story short I decided to grab them!' (well a few of them anyway.)

The Grafton Street location was the number one VIP-haunt in Dublin for over two decades. Over the years just about every visiting celebrity would have graced the dance floor of Lillie's & relaxed in the famous red velvet & faux leather chairs.

We now have 11 pieces of Dublin nightlife history spread between Café Novello & La Bucca Ratoath and after careful consideration we have given each chair a plaque and named each of them after one of the celebrities who have sat on them.

In Novello you can now enjoy a flat white while sitting in Julia Robert's chair or an iced latte in Liam Neeson's. In La Bucca you can enjoy a rib-eye steak in Bruce Springsteen or Mick Jagger's chair or tuck into freshly made pizza or pasta in Tom Jones' or Rod Stewart's chair.

Unlike Lillie's, we don't have Paul Harrington as our resident pianist belting out 'Rock & Roll Kids' until the early hours of the morning, but he is booked to perform in The Venue on Saturday 16th December, so why not begin a night of nostalgia in La Bucca's historic chairs before heading up to the show!

# SEVEN DAYS WITHOUT PIZZA MAKES ONE WEAK

**P**rior to the pandemic, which now feels like a distant memory, we opened a pizza dough factory on the Ballybin Road. We began by making our own dough for La Bucca and then tentatively branched out to third party sales. Just as the business was starting to get established Covid came along and we lost our customer base.

Over the last couple of years we have started to rekindle the business and have been busy all summer making pizza dough for the seemingly ever expanding concert and festival scene in Ireland. If you were at Harry Styles, Bruce Springsteen, Electric Picnic or any of the Malahide Castle events this summer and ordered a pizza from one of the festival vendors, the chances are the pizza base came from our dough factory just outside Ratoath.

The original recipe for our Batch#10 dough dates back to 1965 in London's Soho where Peter Boizot opened his first pizza restaurant on Wardour Street. I was privileged to work with Peter for a few years and was entrusted with his recipe. We have adjusted it slightly to allow for the different components of Irish Springs flour & the Meath water supply (when we have one) but we are very happy with the end result.

We have decided to promote our pizzas every Wednesday in all La Bucca restaurants by giving 20% discounts off all pizzas ordered whilst dining in. We've been running the promotion for a few weeks now and it has proved very successful, so we would recommend advance bookings. # RUGBY'S BACK AT RATOATH RFC

As the Rugby Season kicks into gear, our senior team is back in pre-season, aiming to repeat the highs of last season's McGee Cup win, with our Under 18s training alongside. Numbers continue to grow at senior level, and we're very pleased to be able to introduce a 2nd XV for the upcoming 23/24 season, which will be the first time in our history we have fielded two senior teams.
